

Minden Gardnerville Sanitation District District Manager's Report November 2009

- 1. EDU allocations: No EDU's were allocated during the month of October.
- 2. <u>EDU calculations</u>: Due to the concern of calculating EDU requirements for triple and double sinks, particularly within food preparation establishments, the Board instructed me to explore other calculation procedures. Attached is a letter form MGSD legal counsel dated September 21, 2005, in which the definition of a drain is stated. In addition, I have included some recommendations in regards to the calculations. (See attached sheets).
- 3. <u>Digester Expansion Project:</u> The contractor has reached final completion with the exception of some warranty items and demobilization of equipment from the site. After all equipment has been removed, I will meet with Craig Olson to give authorization to finalize the project.
- 4. <u>Garage Building:</u> The garage building has been completed. With 4 available bays we are planning on using 3 bays for truck and equipment storage and utilizing the 4th bay for parts storage. We have purchased locks for the doors and would like install shelving for the parts storage. MGSD personnel will be installing the electrical before we fully utilize the buildings.
- 5. <u>Bently Bio-Solids Permit:</u> Bently has received their long awaited biosolids permit which will allow MGSD to transport its bio-solids to them. They are in the process of modifications to their facilities and should be ready to accept bio-solids after the first of January. We should to expect to pay approximately \$14.00/yd
- 6. <u>Effluent Disposal:</u> We discharged 55.36 MG/ 169.95 AC FT of effluent during the month of October. Although we lowered the reservoirs near to the minimal level to alleviate having to pump during the non-irrigation rate season, we anticipate having to pump at some point during mid January
