

Minden Gardnerville Sanitation District District Manager's Report August 2009

- 1. EDU allocations: No EDU's were allocated during the month of July
- 2. <u>Digester Expansion Project:</u> While the cleaning of Digester # 2 is still in progress, the majority of the rest of the project is complete. With the punch-list items being now being addressed, the project has progressed nicely, with only a few minor issues left to contend with at this time.
- 3. Primary # 3: The Board authorized work to proceed with the re-coating of the interior of primary # 3 at the July meeting. After discussing it further with Craig Olson of HDR, we decided that it may be beneficial to bid it out with the upcoming grease project in an effort to obtain a better quote. Craig will be attending the meeting to give a status report of the current project and will discuss the primacy clarifier coating project as well.
- 4. <u>Effluent Disposal:</u> We discharged 42.96 MG or132 AC/FT of effluent from the reservoirs during the month of July.
- 5. Security system: At the July meeting representatives from Tesco were present to demonstrate a video security system. It appears that any discounts in the insurance premium would be minimal at best and have a long pay back time. In addition, I spoke with representatives from both the City of West Sacramento and Fontana Water Departments. Both entities monitor multiple areas throughout their districts and reported favorable results with the systems they have in place. Both entities have had copper and other metals stolen and have been able to get license plate numbers and identify the culprits.
